

## What is the "Tail Waggers Strut"?

The 2nd Annual Tail Waggers Strut is a dog walk festival to raise money for our Sanctuary Building Fund, to build Bucks County's first no-kill animal sanctuary.

The walk for adults, youth and families is 4 miles. A shorter, 2-mile walk is also available.

In addition to the walk, the festival offers:

- Over 100 pet products and services vendors, nonprofit organizations, and crafters
- Food vendors and live entertainment
- Activities for the kids
- Special events throughout the day, including:
  - A strolling magician
  - Blessing of the Animals by local clergy
  - Kruisin' Kanines agility demonstration
  - Ask the Trainer/Ask the Vet
- A new SuperAdoption event with over 100 adoptable dogs and cats.

## When Should I Register for the Strut?

NOW! We encourage all walkers to pre-register for the event. Our success mainly depends on the pledges you obtain for the walk.

The goal for this year is \$100,000 – so the earlier you begin, the more money you can raise! The suggested minimum pledge amount is \$100. **This year, we challenge you to double your pledges to \$200.**

## Is there an Extra Charge for the SuperAdoption?

No. Your registration fee is the same for the dog walk festival or the SuperAdoption; both entitle you to all the events & festivities. If you adopt a dog or cat through the SuperAdoption, your registration fee will be deducted from the adoption fee.

## How Do I Raise Pledge Money?

After completing registration, download/print (or call for) Pledge Forms. Ask your friends, family, co-workers, teachers—everyone you know! Explain that the money will be used exclusively for our Sanctuary Building Fund—to build the first no-kill sanctuary in Bucks County. Add that person's name to your pledge form—include contact information if that person would like to be added to our mailing list. Last, obtain the pledge—it's best to collect pledge money at the time the pledge is made, and turn it in at check-in on the day of the event.

## How Much Pledge Money Should I Raise?

As much as you can! However, in order to meet our goal, each walker is asked to raise at least the suggested minimum total of \$100 (\$50 for elementary school students). All walkers who raise the suggested minimum pledge monies will receive a 2nd Annual Tail Waggers Strut t-shirt.

## What Happens If I Raise the Most Pledge Money?

You will win a great prize, that's what! Competitions to raise the most pledge money will be held for the following categories:

## How Can I Walk as Part of a Team?

A **Team** consists of 10-15 walkers—either adults (18 years or older) or youth (13-17 years). To create a team, just choose a team name, team leader, and color for your team t-shirt. Include the team name on your Walker Registration Form.

A junior high or high **School** can also create a team of 50 or more walkers. A faculty member or administrator should become the team leader. Choose a team name and color for your team t-shirt. Include your school's name and district, and the team name on your Walker Registration Form.

**Families** can also walk as a team. Choose a team name and color for your team t-shirt. An adult family member should become the team leader; only that person needs to complete a Walker Registration Form.

For all teams, after you have completed your Walker Registration Form, download/print (call for) a Team Sign-up Form, School Team Sign-up Form, or Family Team Sign-up Form. Follow the instructions to complete the form. Then, download/print (or call for) your Pledge Forms, and you are ready to go!

\*\*Kids (5-7 years old) can form teams as well. Just pick up a "Kids Can, Too!" Walkers Brochure and Registration Form.

### What is The Crossings Animal Sanctuary?

The Crossings Animal Sanctuary, Inc., located in Washington Crossing, PA, is a non-profit, no-kill animal welfare organization begun in February 2009. In addition to building Bucks County's first no-kill sanctuary, its mission is to provide quality care and a loving home for every dog and cat in Bucks County and the surrounding area.

### Why Do We Need a No-Kill Animal Sanctuary?

This year in the United States, 3 to 4 million adoptable dogs and cats will lose their lives in our country's animal shelters. This number is equivalent to nearly One in 20 household dogs and cats that are put to death. Bucks County is no exception—thousands of homeless dogs and cats have their lives cut short here every year.

No single group or facility by itself can end the killing of homeless animals. But a no-kill sanctuary, working hand-in-hand with the area shelters, animal rescue organizations, foster homes, and you, the animal lovers of Bucks County, can create a Bucks County where there are truly "No More Homeless Pets".

### What Do We Mean By "No More Homeless Pets"?
